Welcome to the **Sensory Map** for our current exhibition
The dead don't go until we do.

The dead don't go until we do features textile collage, sculptural installation, film, drawing, sound and environment. It runs across the White Gallery, Side Gallery, Upper Gallery, White Gallery Balcony, Georgian Gallery and Georgian Gallery Balcony.

These rooms vary from light to dimly-lit, with some artificial light coming from a screen, as well as audio from speakers. There is seating provided in some parts of the gallery. We kindly ask our visitors to not touch any of the artworks, except in the Georgian Gallery where you can sit on the artwork. Please do not bring food or drink into the gallery.

If you need any additional access or sensory resources, please ask our Volunteer Exhibition Assistants at the Welcome Desk.



Level 2 White Gallery and Side Gallery

The **White Gallery** is located on Level 2 and is the first room you enter when taking the stairs from Level 0. You will be greeted by one of our Volunteers at our **Welcome Desk**, where you can also find exhibition guides, portable chairs, access resources and ask them for any further information.

You will also find our hallway where our **Toilets** and **Gallery Shop** are located. It is a brightly lit space and can have groups of people waiting in it. The chair lift is also located here, which can take you up to the **Georgian Gallery**.

The **Side Gallery** is a smaller room and is often less busy. There are stairs that can take you up to Level 3 on the far left of the room.


The **White Gallery** is a large room, with blue walls. The **Side Gallery** is a smaller room. In these rooms are colourful textile collages by Malgorzata Mirga-Tas.

Level 3 Upper Gallery, White Gallery Balcony and Round Room


The **Upper Gallery** is a medium sized room, with black walls. In this room are sculptures, poetry, drawings, video and installations by Amol K Patil.

Past the Upper Gallery is the **White Gallery Balcony** with a view over the main White Gallery. At the end of the Balcony is a sofa.

The **Round Room** is a circular space with a dome skylight and white walls. In this room are drawings, watercolours, embroideries and installations by Kang Seung Lee.




Level 3 Georgian Gallery Balcony



The **Georgian Gallery Balcony** overlooks the Georgian Gallery on Level 3. It has a narrow passageway with a width of 1.94m (from the wall to the railing). Running along the balcony walls is a text by the artist collective MADEYOULOOK. As you enter the Georgian Gallery Balcony from the Round Room, there is a Reading Room to your left.

Level 2 Georgian Gallery



You can enter our **Georgian Gallery** at the end of the corridor past the **Toilets** and **Gallery Shop** on Level 2. There are 5 steps up to this gallery and we have a chair lift available for wheelchair users. Please speak to a Volunteer if you require the lift.

In the Georgian Gallery is a sound piece and environment by the artist duo MADEYOULOOK.

In the back left corner of the Georgian Gallery there is a spiral staircase (22 steps in total) leading up to the **Georgian Gallery Balcony** on Level 3.

The **Toilets** and **Gallery Shop** are located in the hallway. You will find the **Welcome Desk** on the other side of this hallway.
